To support "**Coastal, Marine and Island Specific Biodiversity Management in ESA-IO Coastal States programme**"

The **Indian Ocean Commission (IOC)**, in collaboration with the **government of Kenya**, is seeking proposals to develop and strengthen national and regional capacity to manage the direct and indirect use of coastal, marine and island-specific eco-systems towards the sustainable conservation of biodiversity, with financial assistance from the Biodiversity-IOC project, funded by the EU 10th EDF.

The project will be implemented in the following countries: **Union des Comores, Kenya, Madagascar, Mauritius, Seychelles and Tanzania.**

SUBMISSION OF MEMORANDA

Article 118(1)(b) of the Constitution provides that "*Parliament shall facilitate public participation and involvement in the legislative and other business of Parliament and its Committees.*" Standing Order 127(3) states that "*the Departmental Committee to which a Bill is committed shall facilitate public participation and shall take into account views and recommendations of the public when the Committee makes its report to the House.*"

The **Kenya Roads Bill, 2015** has undergone First Reading pursuant to Standing 127(3) and is now committed to the Departmental Committee on Transport, Public Works and Housing for consideration and thereafter report to the House.

Pursuant to Article 118(1)(b) and Standing Order 127(3), the Committee invites interested members of the Public to submit any representations they may have on the said bill.
